Dear PECl electricity group members,

Please find attached the draft final report by the consultants. It is structured in a way to shortly describe all steps during the selection process, but without going into details about the issues described in the previous reports. Instead, it focuses on the results of the market and network simulations, and CBAs for each pre-eligible project, including the sensitivities. I would like to invite you to review the draft report, and to send your comments until **4 June, noon (CET)**.

I am also attaching 3 possible lists of the draft preliminary PECl projects. A decision which list will be suggested at this stage, is on the representatives in this group coming from the ministries and the regulatory authorities. Detail rationale for proposing these draft 3 lists is explained in the draft report, and in line with the minutes of our meeting on 19 May 2026. I will here just summarise the main issues:

List 1 contains all 8 projects with positive CBA results according to the agreed methodology and input data as defined by the Contracting Parties and ENTSO-E, despite any uncertainties especially in the long-time frame (2050).

List 2 contains 5 projects which are robust enough against the initial assumptions for 2050, meaning that these projects have positive CBA results no matter of the sensitivities regarding the applied methodology and input data for 2050.

List 3 contains 4 projects which are robust enough against most uncertainties analysed by the consultants through the sensitivity analyses, and against unclear support from the relevant ministry and regulatory authority.

I would like to invite you to send your opinion on which list do you support as the draft preliminary PECE list, also until 4 June, noon (CET).

If I receive no responses from the ministries and regulatory authorities, I will assume that **list 3** should be proposed as the draft preliminary PECE list. A rationale for proposing that list is to minimise a risk of proposing projects highly exposed to long-term uncertainties, and to have the PECE list which will not contain different projects jumping on and off the list every two years.

Anyway, after we receive an opinion from ECRB that will arrive by the end of August, we may discuss the possible lists once again on our meeting scheduled for 2 September, 10am (CET).

Looking forward to your replies, best regards.

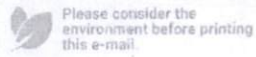
